Equally at home on Baroque and modern instruments, Michael has performed with The Washington Bach Consort, Folger Consort, Modern Musick, Wolf Trap Opera Company, and the Fairfax Symphony, among other groups.

John Armato came from Los Angeles to Baltimore to study classical guitar at the Peabody Conservatory, then went on to earn a Master's in lute performance there. He has performed with a number of area ensembles including Peabody Consort and National Gallery of Art Vocal Ensemble, and has also toured extensively in Japan and Taiwan.
